December Trivia Question: Who is the confederate soldier who was tried, convicted and hanged as a “war criminal” over the protests of Clara Barton?

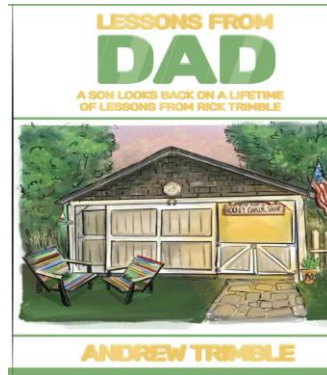

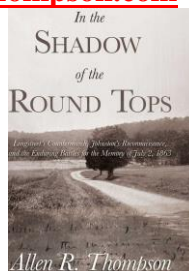
The JSCWRT meets the second Wednesday of the month at 7PM on the campus of [Ocean County College](#)
